Welcome to Lancaster Priory.

This year's Advent Carol Service is shaped around the theme of the messengers. We recall the prophets, John the Baptist and the early church faithful in their witness to the coming Christ and his Kingdom. We pray that we might share in their experience and that we may be renewed as God's messengers of hope in our generation.

Behold, the Bridegroom cometh: go ye out with lighted lamps and garlands round about to meet Him in a rapture with a shout. (Advent Sunday, Christina Rossetti)

The priory rests in darkness and silence. The Easter Candle and congregational candles are lit. The clergy, choir and servers gather in quire aisle.

Introit The Advent Prose

Reading Isaiah 40.4-11

A voice cries in the wilderness: Prepare the way of the Lord

A voice cries out: 'In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain.

Then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.'

A voice says, 'Cry out!' And I said, 'What shall I cry?' All people are grass, their constancy is like the flower of the field. The grass withers, the flower fades, when the breath of the Lord blows upon it; surely the people are grass. The grass withers, the flower fades; but the word of our God will stand for ever. Get you up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good tidings; lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good tidings, lift it up, do not fear; say to the cities of Judah,

'Here is your God!' See, the Lord God comes with might, and his arm rules for him; his reward is with him, and his recompense before him.

He will feed his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms, and carry them in his bosom, and gently lead the mother sheep.

As we meet to celebrate the coming of God's Kingdom let us celebrate with music and hymns of praise, that our lives may be charged with his life, that we may bear witness to his glory, and so bring light to those who sit in darkness.

Let us pray for those amongst whom Christ was born:

the poor, the helpless, the aged and young children; the cold, the hungry, and the homeless; those who live in the shadow of war; all victims of war, poverty, injustice, greed and oppression; the sick, the bereaved; the lonely, the

unloved; and all those in despair and without hope. As we hear again God's promises of justice and peace on earth, let us pray for the leaders of the nations, that they may work tirelessly to establish and maintain justice, freedom, and peace. And, so following in the footsteps of the messengers who have proclaimed the coming of Christ and his kingdom, we pray that we may bear true witness to this vision of God's kingdom in our own generation. Praying that through our lives and the life of the church, we may bring about peace, unity and reconciliation in a broken and divided world. Finally, as we rejoice with the saints in light, let us remember all those who have gone before us with the sign of faith, whose hope was in the Word made flesh, Jesus Christ our Lord. And now, summing up all our prayers, let us pray for the coming of Christ's kingdom in the words our Lord himself has taught us

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

Reading Isaiah 61.1-3,11

Reading Luke 1.5-25 The birth of John the Baptist is foretold

In the days of King Herod of Judea, there was a priest named Zechariah, who belonged to the priestly order of Abijah. His wife was a descendant of Aaron, and her name was Elizabeth. Both of them were righteous before God, living blamelessly according to all the commandments and regulations of the Lord. But they had no children, because Elizabeth was barren, and both were getting on in years.

Once when he was serving as priest before God and his section was on duty, he was chosen by lot, according to the custom of the priesthood, to enter the sanctuary of the Lord and offer incense. Now at the time of the incenseoffering, the whole assembly of the people was praying outside. Then there appeared to him an angel of the Lord, standing at the right side of the altar of incense. When Zechariah saw him, he was terrified; and fear overwhelmed him. But the angel said to him, 'Do not be afraid, Zechariah, for your prayer has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you will name him John. You will have joy and gladness, and many will rejoice at his birth, for he will be great in the sight of the Lord. He must never drink wine or strong drink; even before his birth he will be filled with the Holy Spirit. He will turn many of the people of Israel to the Lord their God. With the spirit and power of Elijah he will go before him, to turn the hearts of parents to their children, and the disobedient to the wisdom of the righteous, to make ready a people prepared for the Lord.' Zechariah said to the angel, 'How will I know that this is so? For I am an old man, and my wife is getting on in years.' The angel replied, 'I am Gabriel. I stand in the presence of God, and I have been sent to speak to you and to bring you this good news. But now, because you did not believe my words, which will be fulfilled in their time, you will become mute, unable to speak, until the day these things occur.'

Meanwhile, the people were waiting for Zechariah, and wondered at his delay in the sanctuary. When he did come out, he could not speak to them, and they realized that he had seen a vision in the sanctuary. He kept motioning to them and remained unable to speak. When his time of service was ended, he went to his home. After those days his wife Elizabeth conceived, and for five months she remained in seclusion. She said, 'This is what the Lord has done for me when he looked favourably on me and took away the disgrace I have endured among my people.'
