Welcome to Lancaster Priory

We are really pleased that you are worshipping with us today. Wherever you have come from, this is your church and you are unconditionally welcome.

Christmas is probably the most loved celebration of the Christian year and is celebrated by many who would not go to church at any other time of year. At Christmas we remember one of the great truths of Christianity. We remember that God loves us and wants to be with us in all the ups and downs of our lives. God chose to live a human life being born to a poor and apparently insignificant family. As we celebrate Jesus' birth we are celebrating this wonderful truth, that God has come to live with us.

Our Christingles consist of:

- An orange, representing the world
- A candle pushed into the centre of the orange, then lit, representing Jesus Christ as Light of the World
- A red ribbon wrapped around the orange or a paper frill around the candle, representing the Blood of Christ
- Sweets skewered on cocktail sticks pushed into the orange, representing the fruits of the earth and the four seasons.

This service can be traced back to the 1700s but was made popular in this country in the late 1960s, when it became associated with the Children's Society. Every year Christingle raises over a million pounds to support vulnerable children living in our country.

The restrictions under which our services are being conducted at the moment are part of our responsibility to ensure that all who worship and visit the priory feel safe and valued. These are available on an additional flyer at the back of church. Thank you for your patience.

The Welcome and Notices
