Festival in Daily Life, Blackburn Cathedral, Saturday 19 March - The Festival of Faith in Daily Life will be a time to reflect on how we can all be confident disciples, witnesses and leaders for Jesus Christ in our homes, workplaces and communities. Bishop Philip will preside at a Eucharist sung by the Cathedral Youth Choir. The keynote address will be from Lord David Alton of Liverpool about how faith has affected his working life of public service. The workshops will include: faith at home; faith at work; and living alongside people of other faiths. The Vine Community will be introduced. This is a simple and flexible framework for living out a Christian life, sometimes called a 'rule of life' The Festival is free, but you need to book in advance so that the Cathedral can manage workshop numbers.
