### Present situation

The money we give makes possible the ministry of this church. It is that simple.

For 2023 we expect our church to need £4781 per week for the work of ministry, worship, service and mission. This breaks down as:

£1821 for our share of clergy, housing, training and support costs (this is the Parish share).

£1247 for our building, including insurance heat light etc. and paying our cleaner.

£1713 for worship and ministry costs to and in the community, including paying our staff and giving away 10% of our planned giving income to other Christian charities

## Planning our income

To meet this challenge our expected income for the year looks like £3,505 in weekly terms, made up of:

£2367 from giving, including Gift Aid reclaimed from HM Revenue and Customs

£1138 from weddings, funerals, concerts, restricted and any other income.

So most of our income is from the giving of our church family. To fund our ministry this year we anticipate we will need an increase in weekly giving of £1276

## Plans for our future

We pray that our life and ministry will grow and develop this year as we continue to reach out to our local community, maintain our services and worship, pay our bills, support our organisations and ministry and service in our community and keep our buildings in good repair. In fact, all those things that make up the life of the Priory here in Lancaster.

The PCC discerned four priorities for mission and ministry at its 2022 away day:

#### One: Inspiring new generations.

We long for the Priory congregation to become broader and more diverse, better representative of our parish and city.

#### Two: Growing deeper roots on the Marsh.

We believe that we have been called to witness through word and service to proclaim the message of God's unconditional love on the Marsh.

Three: A Resource for the City, Diocese and Region We believe we are called to be a place of teaching and learning that empowers the people of God in a way that will benefit the whole diocese, and we seek to develop new ministries in this area.

#### Four: Caring better for God's Creation

We are committed to doing all we can at church and in our own lives to protect God's creation, and acknowledge the generosity of God in his Creation.

By God's grace and with your help we will continue all this - and more. Thank you for your partnership in the gospel, the commitment of your time, your skills and abilities and, of course, your generous giving to Lancaster Priory.
