We gather at this service of Choral Evensong to welcome Revd Louis Johnson as our Associate Priest. Below you will read a little bit about him. Please pray for Louis and Christine as they begin a new phase in their lives here in Lancaster.

Revd Louis Johnson

Louis was born, raised and schooled in Liverpool, Louis read Music at Churchill College, University of Cambridge, received his MMus and PhD in Music (Composition) from the University of Liverpool, and taught in the music departments at Liverpool Hope University, and the universities of Liverpool, Cardiff and Bristol, before undertaking training for ordained ministry at St Mellitus College, North West (now Emmanuel Theological College), whilst also serving a three-year context-based placement with Liverpool Parish Church, Our Lady & St Nicholas (which was also his sending parish). He was ordained deacon at Michaelmas 2020, and priest at Petertide 2021, at the Anglican Cathedral in his home diocese of Liverpool.

As Louis and his wife, Christine, are both born-and-bred scousers (and Evertonians!), it has taken lots of prayer, thought, and discernment to explore the call to ministry in Lancaster, and answering this call feels like a big step for both of them — but the sense of call is certain, and they are both genuinely excited about this new chapter in their lives, and about getting to know the people and places that make up the parish of Lancaster Priory, the city of Lancaster, and the wider Diocese of Blackburn.

The Priory Choir is directed by Jeremy Truslove (Interim Director of Music), and the organist is Ian Pattinson (Priory Organist).

The Order of Licensing

The Bishop sits. Louis stands before the Bishop and is presented to him by Revd Dr Miranda Threlfall-Holmes, Louis' Training Incumbent.

Miranda introduces Louis. She then says

Bishop Philip, I present Louis to be licensed as Associate Priest of Lancaster Priory.

The Bishop replies

Thank you for your presentation, which I accept.

The candidate turns to face the congregation

Bishop It is my pleasure to introduce Louis, who is to be your new

Associate Priest.

People of this parish and all who share in Christ's ministry here, will you support each other in that ministry and now welcome

Louis among you?

All In Christ's name we will.

Declaration and Oaths

The Declaration of Assent The Bishop addresses Louis

The Church of England is part of the One, Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church worshipping the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It professes the faith uniquely revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the Catholic creeds, which faith the Church is called upon to proclaim afresh in each generation. Led by the Holy Spirit, it has born witness to Christian truth in its historic formularies the Thirty Nine Articles of Religion, the Book of Common Prayer and the Ordering of Bishops, Priests and Deacons. In the declaration you are about to make will you affirm your loyalty to this inheritance of faith as your inspiration and guidance under God in bringing the grace and truth of Christ to this generation and making him known to those in your care?

The candidate makes the following declaration:

I, Louis, do so affirm, and accordingly declare my belief in the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the Catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness; and in public prayer and administration of the sacraments, I will only use the forms of service which are authorised or allowed by Canon.

All stand.

The candidate takes the Oaths, holding the Bible in his right hand

The Oath of Allegiance

I, Louis, do swear that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to His Majesty, King Charles the Third, his heirs and Successors, according to Law; so help me God.

The Oath of Canonical Obedience

I, Louis, do swear by almighty God that I will pay true and canonical obedience to the Lord Bishop of Blackburn and his Successors in all things lawful and honest; so help me God.

The Bishop then replies

Thank you for this declaration of loyalty. On behalf of our diocese I, with all God's people here, undertake to support and uphold you in your new ministry. In token of this we will now sign the Declaration and Oaths.

The Licensing Please sit or kneel, the candidate kneeling before the Bishop.

Bishop Let us pray

Heavenly Father, bless this parish and those who minister here, that with Louis they may fulfil your

loving purposes for those who live and work in this place. We ask

this in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord.

All Amen

Louis do not forget the trust of those who have chosen you. In your work and ministry, and with your colleagues, care alike for young and old, strong and weak, rich and poor.

By your words and in your life preach the gospel.
Give time for yourself, your family and friends.
Love and serve Christ's people. Nourish them
(by word and sacrament) and strengthen them to glorify
God in this life and in the life to come.

The Bishop sits and reads the Licence and gives it to the candidate.

Receive your Licence; in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Taking his staff, the Bishop blesses him saying:

Louis, the Lord give you courage, wisdom, strength and love to do his will: and the blessing of God Almighty, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, rest upon you and remain with you always. Amen.

The First Lesson 1 Samuel 24.1-17

Read by Dame Pauline Fielding, PCC member & Deanery Synod Representative.

A reading from the first book of Samuel.

When Saul returned from following the Philistines, he was told, 'David is in the wilderness of En-gedi.' Then Saul took three thousand chosen men out of all Israel, and went to look for David and his men in the direction of the Rocks of the Wild Goats. He came to the sheepfolds beside the road, where there was a cave; and Saul went in to relieve himself. Now David and his men were sitting in the innermost parts of the cave. The men of David said to him, 'Here is the day of which the Lord said to you, "I will give your enemy into your hand, and you shall do to him as it seems good to you." '

Then David went and stealthily cut off a corner of Saul's cloak. Afterwards David was stricken to the heart because he had cut off a corner of Saul's cloak. He said to his men, 'The Lord forbid that I should do this thing to my lord, the Lord's anointed, to raise my hand against him; for he is the Lord's anointed.' So David scolded his men severely and did not permit them to attack Saul. Then Saul got up and left the cave, and went on his way.

Afterwards David also rose up and went out of the cave and called after Saul, 'My lord the king!' When Saul looked behind him, David bowed with his face to the ground, and did obeisance. David said to Saul, 'Why do you listen to the words of those who say, "David seeks to do you harm"? This very day your eyes have seen how the Lord gave you into my hand in the cave; and some urged me to kill you, but I spared you. I said, "I will not raise my hand against my lord; for he is the Lord's anointed." See, my father, see the corner of your cloak in my hand; for by the fact that I cut off the corner of your cloak, and did not kill you, you may know for certain that there is no wrong or treason in my hands. I have not sinned against you, though you are hunting me to take my life. May the Lord judge between me and you! May the Lord avenge me on you; but my hand shall not be against you. As the ancient proverb says, "Out of the wicked comes forth wickedness"; but my hand shall not be against you. Against whom has the king of Israel come out? Whom do you pursue? A dead dog? A single flea? May the Lord therefore be judge, and give sentence between me and you. May he see to it, and plead my cause, and vindicate me against you.'

When David had finished speaking these words to Saul, Saul said, 'Is that your voice, my son David?' Saul lifted up his voice and wept. He said to David, 'You are more righteous than I; for you have repaid me good, whereas I have repaid you evil.

Here ends the reading.

Read by Mrs Christine Hill

A reading from the Gospel according to Luke.

He said also to the one who had invited him, 'When you give a luncheon or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or rich neighbours, in case they may invite you in return, and you would be repaid. But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous.'

One of the dinner guests, on hearing this, said to him, 'Blessed is anyone who will eat bread in the kingdom of God!' Then Jesus said to him, 'Someone gave a great dinner and invited many. At the time for the dinner he sent his slave to say to those who had been invited, "Come; for everything is ready now." But they all alike began to make excuses. The first said to him, "I have bought a piece of land, and I must go out and see it; please accept my apologies." Another said, "I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I am going to try them out; please accept my apologies." Another said, "I have just been married, and therefore I cannot come." So the slave returned and reported this to his master.

Then the owner of the house became angry and said to his slave, "Go out at once into the streets and lanes of the town and bring in the poor, the crippled, the blind, and the lame."
