Public Lecture 23rd November at 7.30pm – Please join us for a free Lecture by Revd Dr Mark Vasey-Saunders on on his latest book 'Defusing the Sexuality Debate'. Sunday Parking – During the castle renovations The Duchy has kindly given us permission to use the parking across the front façade of the castle.
