It will work as follows: at 9.30am the entrance bollards (adjacent to the stone steps) will be removed allowing entrance to the parking spaces, at 10am this bollard will be replaced and the exit bollard will be removed (adjacent to the castle gatehouse) then at 12.30 the exit will again be closed.

With the huge increases in the numbers of clients, often with complex issues, the charity and its volunteers are under great pressure. They are therefore immensely grateful to the Priory for its continued support.

Mind the Gap - A message from Refugee Advocacy, Information and Support RAIS. Preventing homelessness among refugees in Lancaster and Morecambe

Refugees granted asylum, are typically given 28 days by the Home Office to find somewhere new to live, set up a bank account, and find a job or apply for Universal Credit, before eviction from their Home Office accommodation. You may be aware from recent articles in the press that the Home Office has now reduced the number of days' notice from 28 days to 7.

RAIS Lancaster would like to set up a refugee hosting scheme, placing new refugees as guests in people's homes while they wait for their paperwork and money to be processed.

If you would like to host a refugee we would provide you with a volunteer to introduce you to your guest and offer support. We can also provide access to an interpreter if needed.

Before the scheme starts we will run an information and Q&A session on Zoom for anyone interested, without obligation.
