The Gathering

We stand. The organ plays as the servers, choir and clergy process, with the Baptism Family, to the font at the west end of the Priory. Please turn to face the font.

The Greeting The president introduces the celebration.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Presentation of the Candidates

The president presents the candidates for baptism and then addresses the congregation

Jesus said, 'Let the children come to me. Do not stop them'. We thank God for Agnes Olivia and Martin William who have come for baptism today. Christ loves them and welcomes them into his Church. So I ask you all: Will you support them as they begin their journey of faith? We will.

Will you help them to live and grow within God's family? We will.

The president then addresses the parents and godparents God knows each of us by name and we are his. Parents and godparents, you speak for Agnes and Martin today. Will you pray for them, and help them to follow Christ? **We will.**

Processional Hymn (NEH 440)

The Baptism Family follow the procession of servers, choir and clergy and return to their seats, the Mothering Sunday Flowers are presented at the altar. We all face the altar and it is censed.

First Reading 1 Samuel 1: 20-end

Please sit.

A reading from the book of Samuel.

In due time Hannah conceived and bore a son. She named him Samuel, for she said, 'I have asked him of the Lord.'

The man Elkanah and all his household went up to offer to the Lord the yearly sacrifice, and to pay his vow. But Hannah did not go up, for she said to her husband, 'As soon as the child is weaned, I will bring him, that he may appear in the presence of the Lord, and remain there for ever; I will offer him as a nazirite for all time.' Her husband Elkanah said to her, 'Do what seems best to you, wait until you have weaned him; only—may the Lord establish his word.' So the woman remained and nursed her son. until she weaned him. When she had weaned him, she took him up with her, along with a three-year-old bull, an ephah of flour, and a skin of wine. The Liturgy of Baptism The Decision

The president addresses the whole congregation to renew their commitment to Christ alongside Martin and Agnes' parents and godparents saying

We all wander far from God and lose our way: Christ comes to find us and welcomes us home. In baptism we respond to his call. Therefore, I ask:

Do you turn away from sin? I do.

Do you reject evil? I do.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour? I do.

Do you trust in him as Lord? I do.

Signing with the Cross

The president makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of the candidates, saying

Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of his cross. Do not be ashamed of Christ. You are his for ever. Stand bravely with him against all the powers of evil, and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, restore in you the image of his glory, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ.

Amen.

Prayer over the Water

The ministers and candidates, families and godparents gather at the baptismal font. The president says

Praise God who made heaven and earth, who keeps his promise forever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

Loving Father, we thank you for your servant Moses, who led your people through the waters of the Red Sea to freedom in the Promised Land. We thank you for your Son Jesus, who has passed through the deep waters of death and opened for all the way of salvation.

Now send your Spirit, that those who are washed in this water may die with Christ and rise with him, to find true freedom as your children, alive in Christ for ever. **Amen.**

Profession of Faith

The president addresses the congregation

Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess on behalf of Agnes and Martin and together with their parents and godparents the faith of the Church.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father, source of all being and life, the one for whom we exist? I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Son, who took our human nature, died for us and rose again? I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit, who gives life to the people of God and makes Christ known in all the world.

I believe and trust in him.

This is the faith of the Church.

This is our faith.

We believe and trust in one God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Baptism

The president baptises each of the candidates saying

N, I baptise you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The president prays with each of the candidates

May God, who has received you by baptism into his Church, pour upon you the riches of his grace, that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people, you may daily be renewed by his anointing Spirit, and come to the inheritance of his saints in glory. **Amen.**

The Welcome The president says

There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism: by one Spirit we are all baptised into one body.

We welcome you into the fellowship of faith; we are children of the same heavenly Father; we welcome you.

The Liturgy of the Sacrament The Peace

We are baptized into Christ: let us live in the Spirit of Christ. The peace of the Lord be always with you and also with you.

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

And all may exchange a sign of peace.

Preparation of the Table Taking of the Bread and Wine

The gifts of the people are gathered and presented.

The altar is prepared and bread and wine are placed upon it.

The president takes the bread and wine.

The Eucharistic Prayer The president sings

The Lord be with you and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

Blessed are you, Lord God, our light and our salvation; to you be glory and praise for ever. From the beginning you have created all things and all your works echo the silent music of your praise. In the fullness of time you made us in your image, the crown of all creation. You give us breath and speech, that with angels and archangels and all the powers of heaven we may find a voice to sing your praise:

Choir Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might.
Heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna, hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

The president continues

Father, we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross; we remember his dying and rising in glory, and we rejoice that he intercedes for us at your right hand.

Pour out your Holy Spirit as we bring before you these gifts of your creation; may they be for us the body and blood of your dear Son. As we eat and drink these holy things in your presence, form us in the likeness of Christ, and build us into a living temple to your glory. Bring us at the last with Mary the Mother of our Lord and all the saints to the vision of that eternal splendour for which you have created us; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, by whom, with whom, and in whom, with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, we worship you, Father almighty, in songs of everlasting praise:
